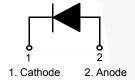
# Description

The FFP08S60S is a STEALTH  $^{\text{TM}}$  II diode with soft recovery characteristics. It is silicon nitride passivated ion-implanted epitaxial planar construction.

This device is intended for use as freewheeling of boost diode in switching power supplies and other power switching applications. Their low stored charge and hyperfast soft recovery minimize ringing and electrical noise in many power switching circuits reducing power loss in the switching transistors.

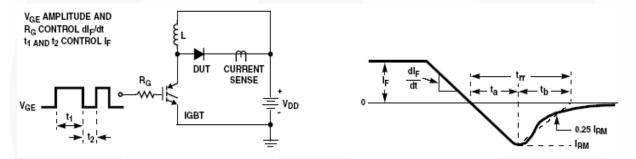


Figure 1. Diode Reverse Recovery Test Circuit & Waveform

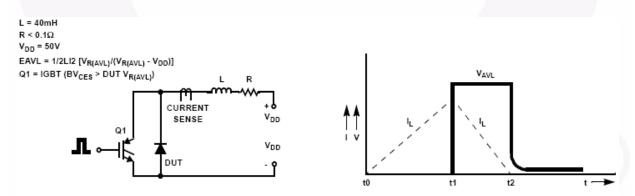
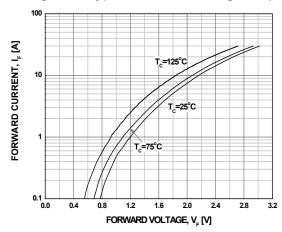


Figure 2. Unclamped Inductive Switching Test Circuit & Waveform

**Figure 4. Typical Reverse Current** 

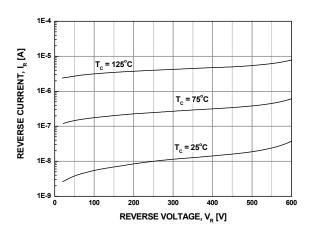


Figure 5. Typical Junction Capacitance

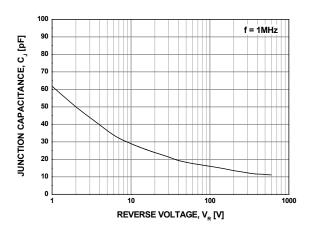


Figure 6. Typical Reverse Recovery Time

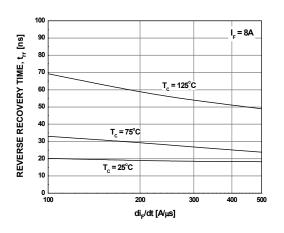
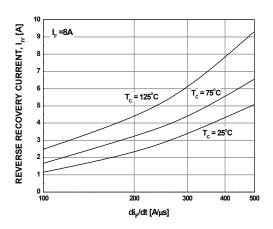
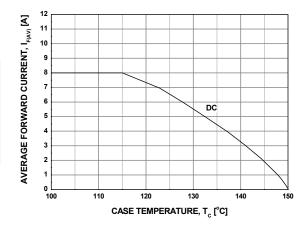


Figure 7. Typical Reverse Recovery Current

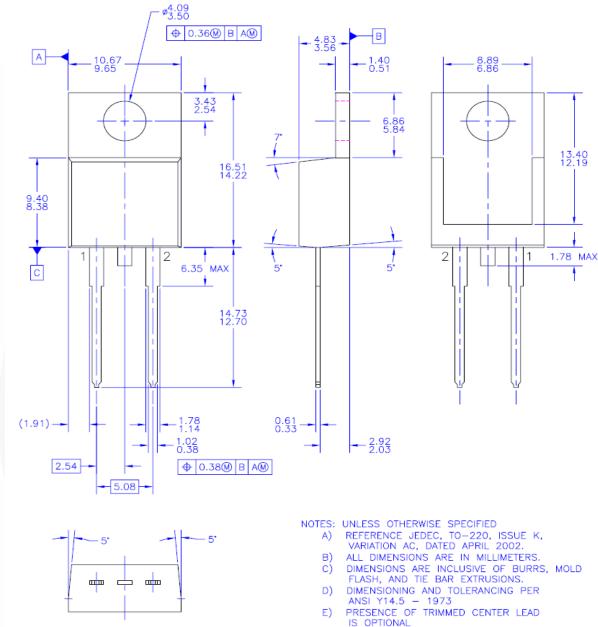


Figure 9. TO-220 2L - 2LD, TO220, JEDEC TO-220 VARIATION AC

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
