



### Fig.1 Power Dissipation Derating Curve


Fig.2 Maximum Safe Operating Area








Fig.7 Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

Drain - Source Voltage : V<sub>DS</sub> [V]




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


## Fig.8 Typical Transfer Characteristics

# Fig.10 Forward Transfer Admittance vs. Drain Current








Fig.11 Drain Current Derating Curve




Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature






Fig.15 Static Drain - Source On - State






Fig.16 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current(III)

Fig.18 Switching Characteristics




Fig.19 Dynamic Input Characteristics






Fig.20 Source Current vs. Source Drain Voltage






Fig.1-1 Switching Time Measurement Circuit




#### Fig.2-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit




#### Fig.3-1 Avalanche Measurement Circuit




#### Fig.1-2 Switching Waveforms

#### Fig.3-2 Avalanche Waveform








