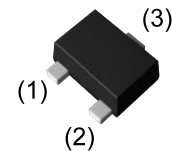

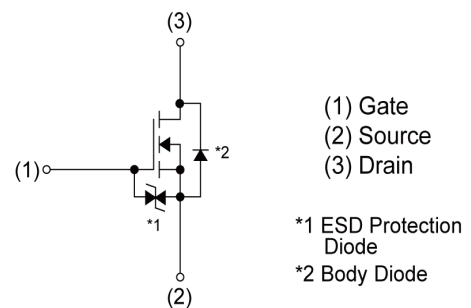

Fig.2 Drain Current Derating Curve

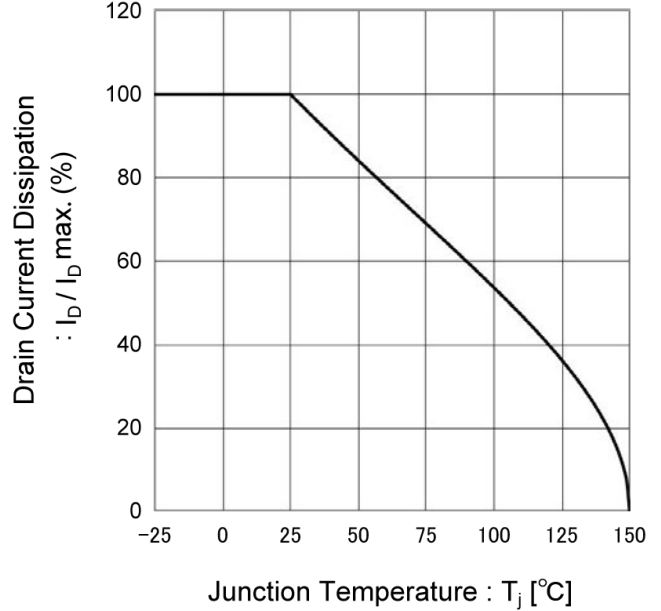


Fig.3 Typical Output Characteristics(I)

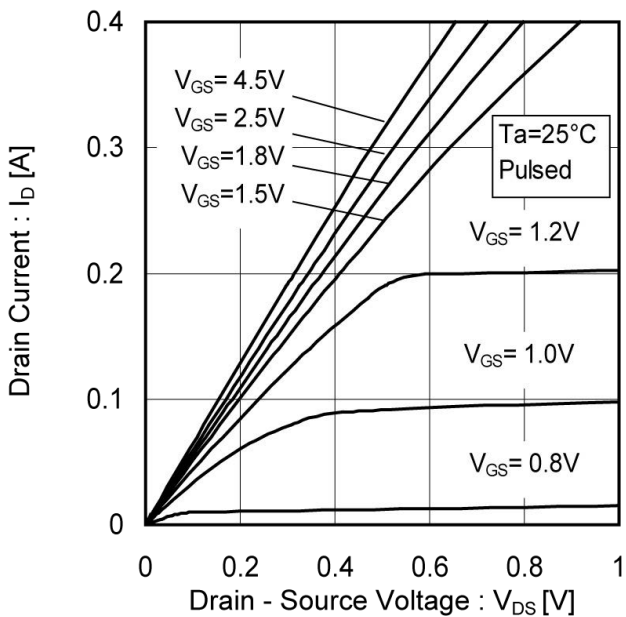
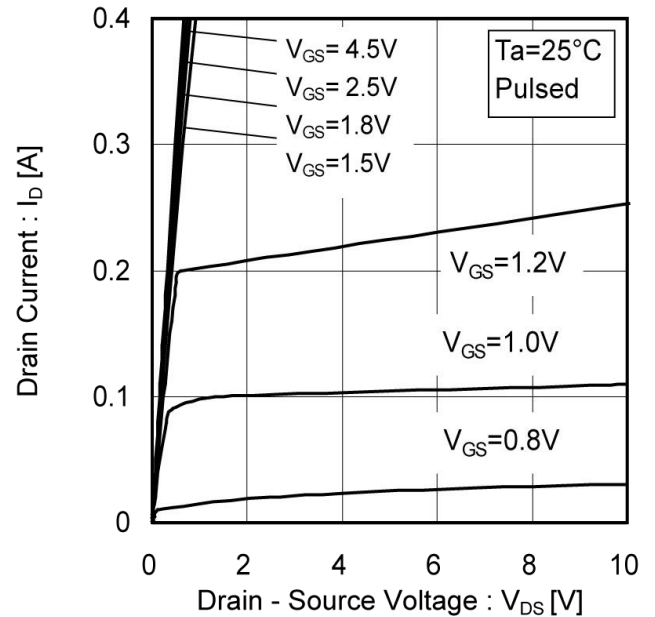


Fig.4 Typical Output Characteristics(II)

Fig.5 Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

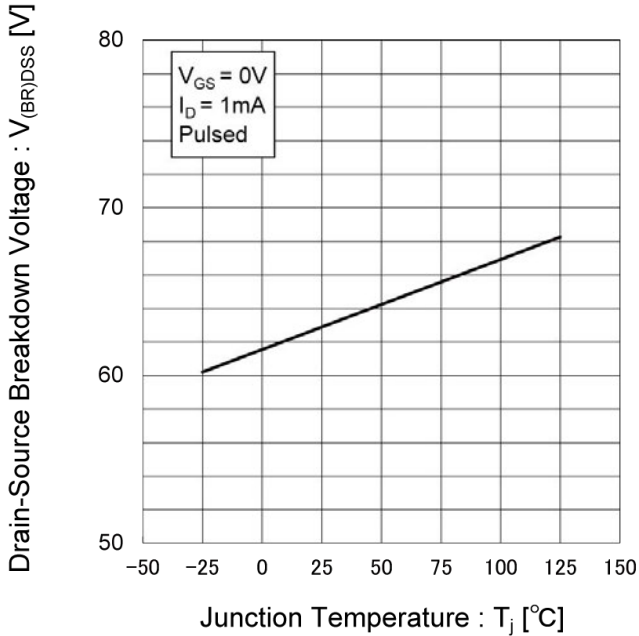


Fig.6 Typical Transfer Characteristics

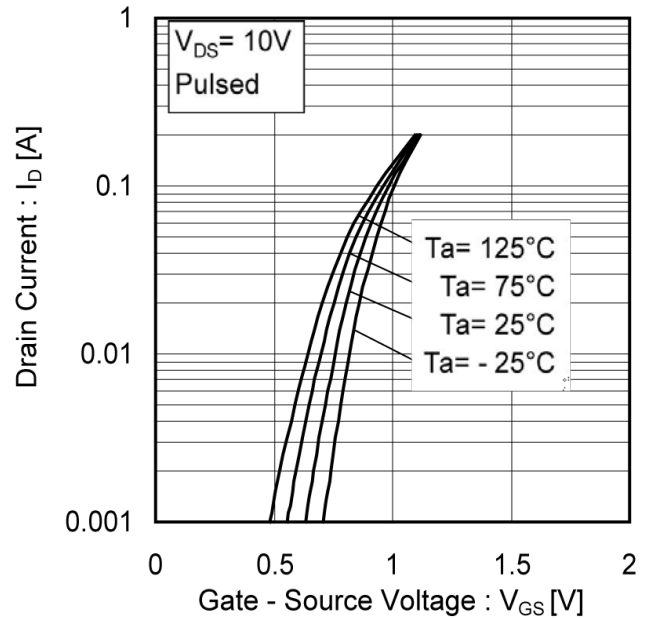


Fig.7 Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

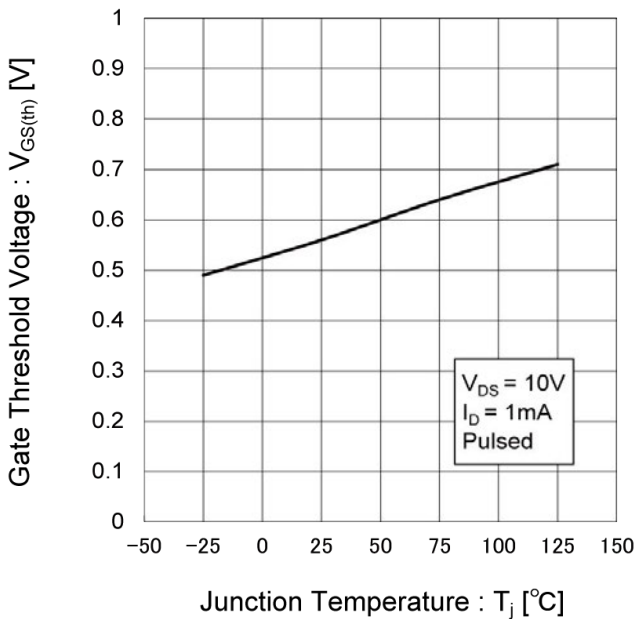
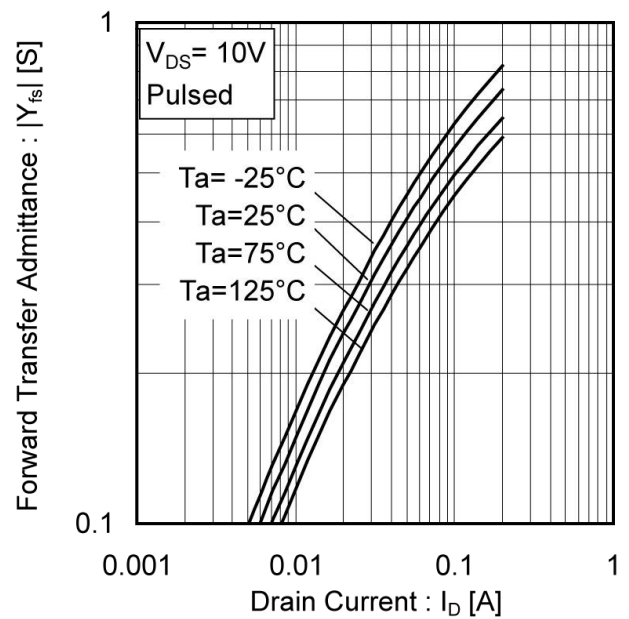


Fig.8 Forward Transfer Admittance vs. Drain Current

Fig.9 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage

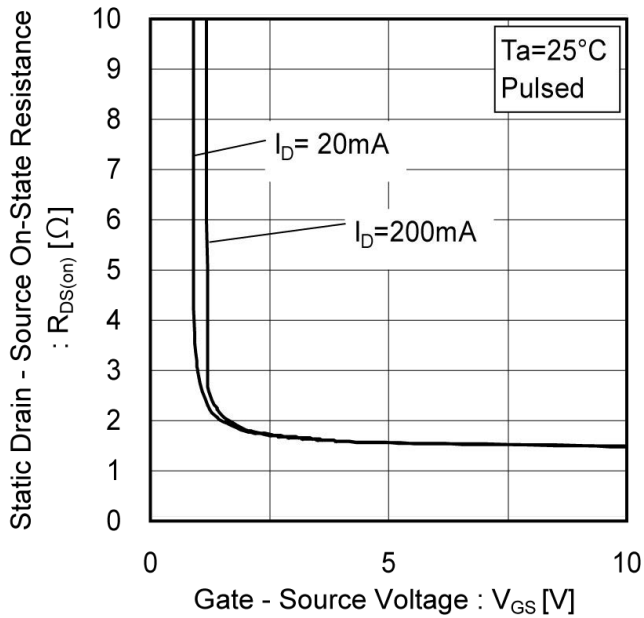


Fig.10 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature

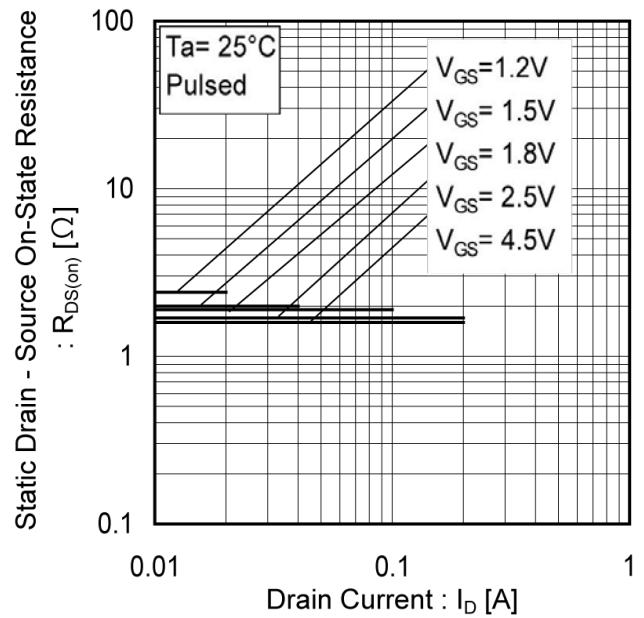


Fig.11 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (I)

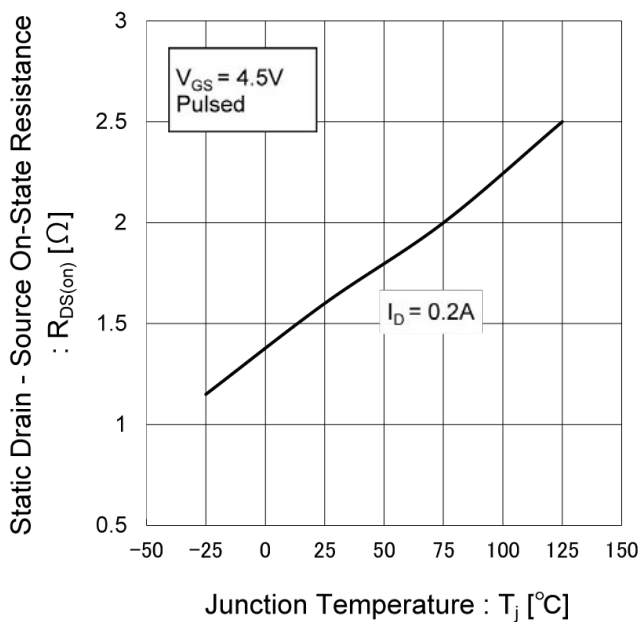
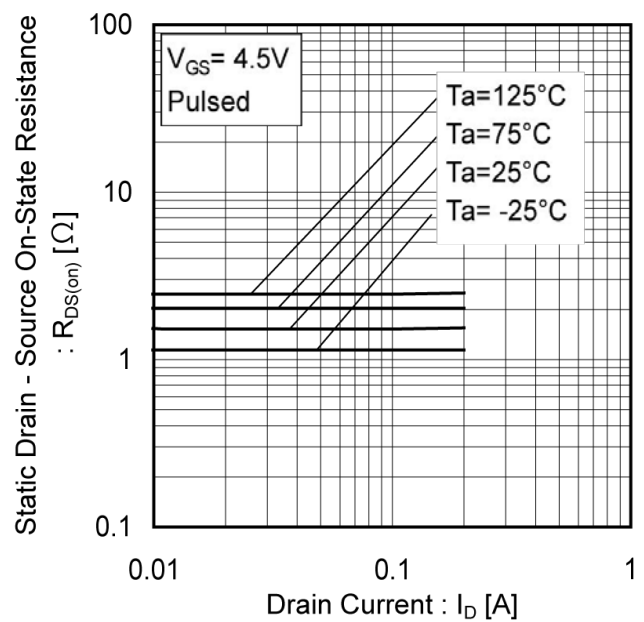


Fig.12 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (II)

Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (III)

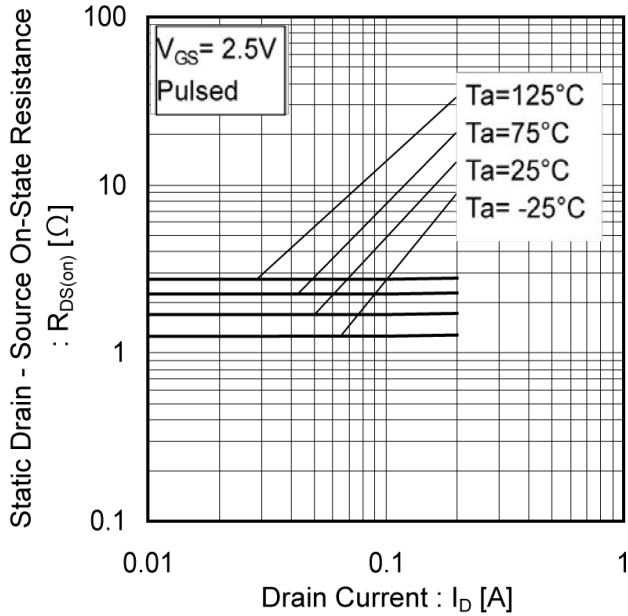


Fig.14 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (IV)

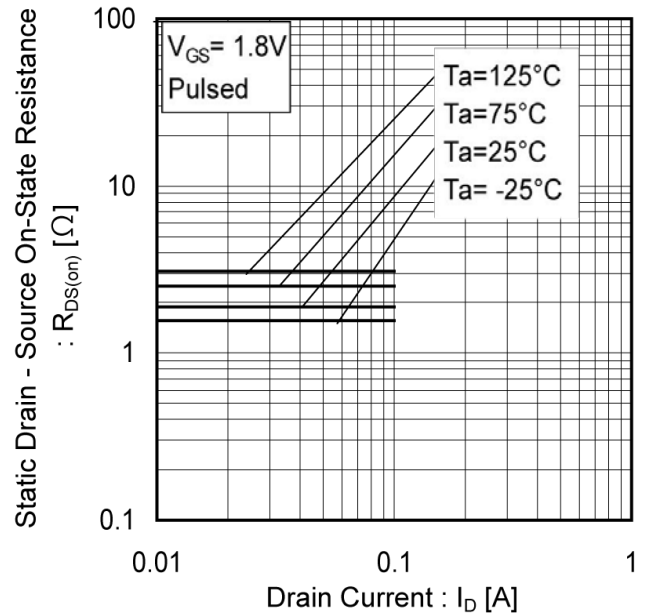


Fig.15 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (V)

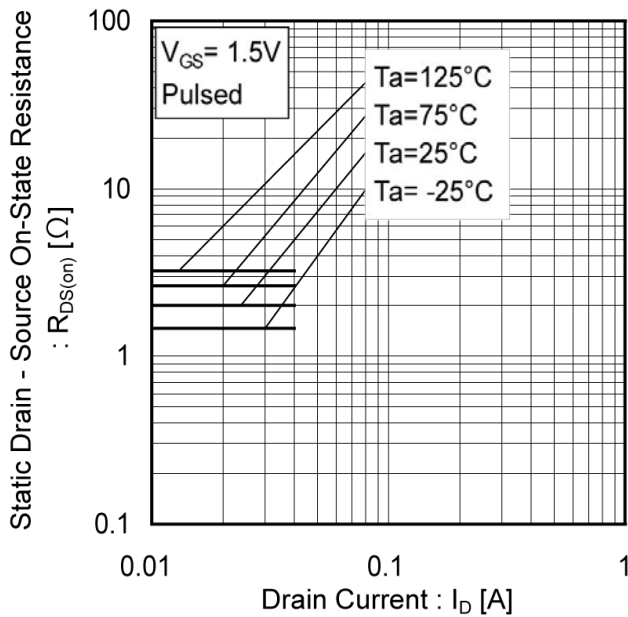
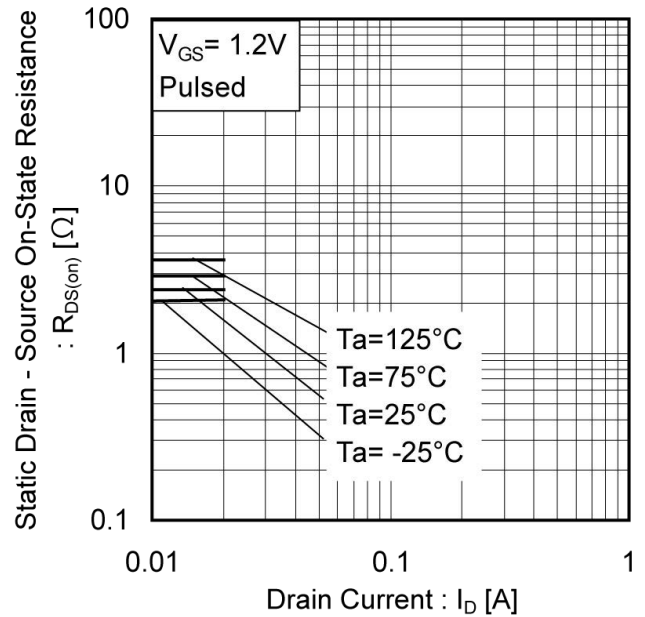


Fig.16 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (VI)

Fig.17 Typical Capacitance vs. Drain - Source Voltage

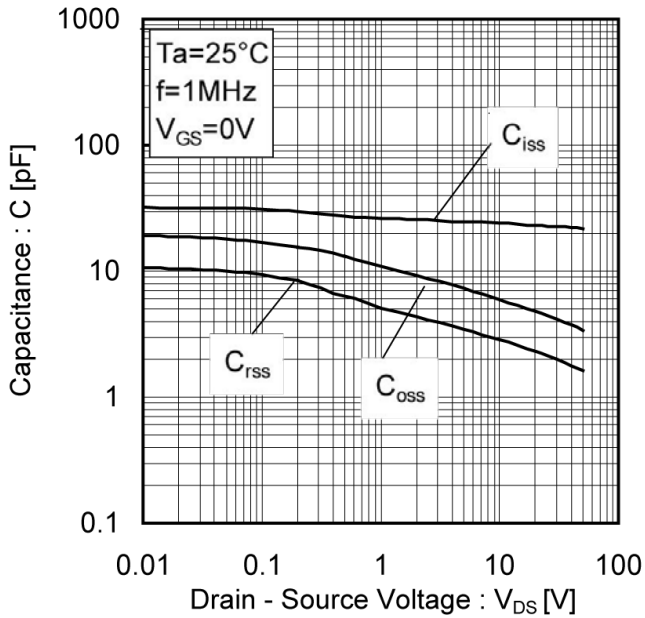


Fig.18 Switching Characteristics

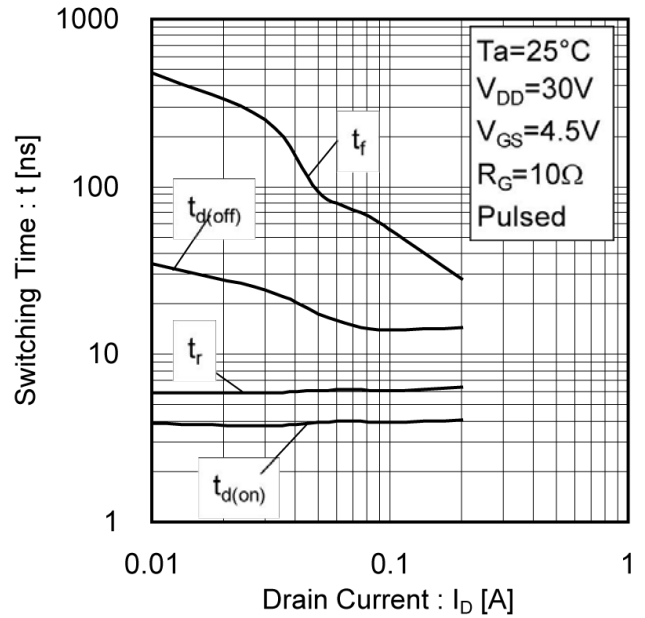
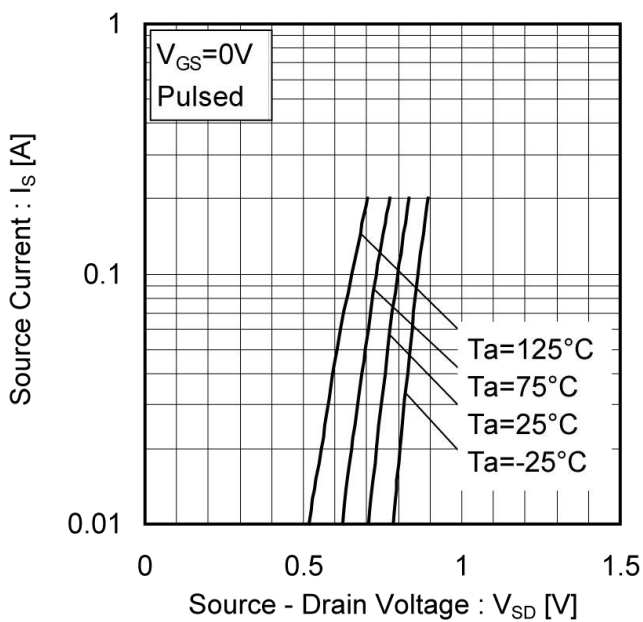


Fig.19 Source Current vs. Source Drain Voltage

Fig. 1-1 SWITCHING TIME MEASUREMENT CIRCUIT

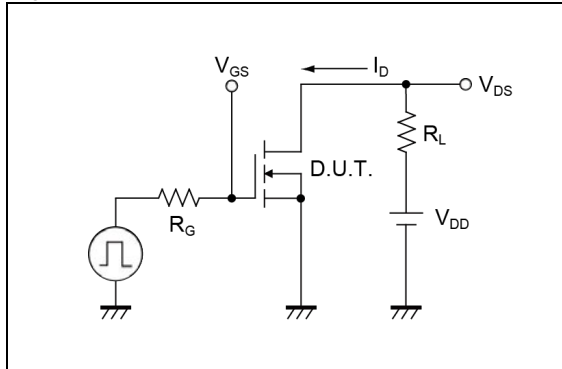
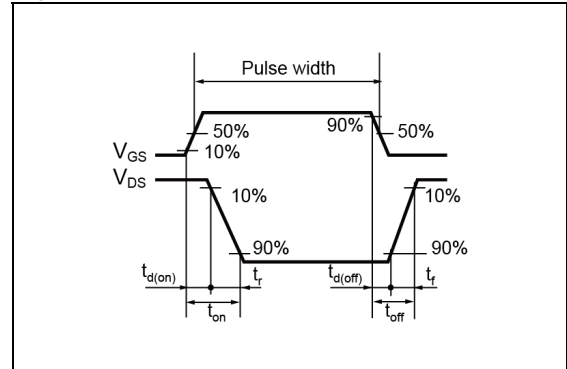


Fig. 1-2 SWITCHING WAVEFORMS

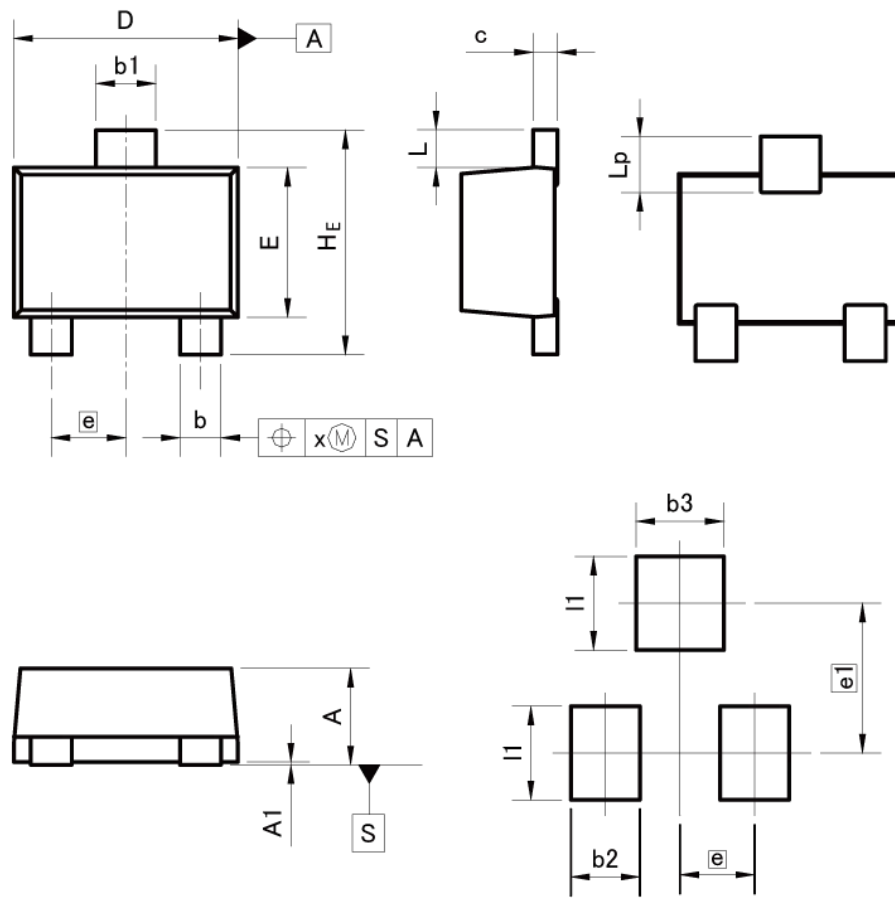

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### Precaution for Electrostatic

Please take proper caution in your manufacturing process and storage so that voltage exceeding the Products maximum rating will not be applied to Products. Please take special care under dry condition (e.g. Grounding of human body / equipment / solder iron, isolation from charged objects, setting of ionizer, friction prevention and temperature / humidity control).

### Precaution for Storage / Transportation

1. Product performance and soldered connections may deteriorate if the Products are stored in the places where:
  - [a] the Products are exposed to sea winds or corrosive gases, including Cl<sub>2</sub>, H<sub>2</sub>S, NH<sub>3</sub>, SO<sub>2</sub>, and NO<sub>2</sub>
  - [b] the temperature or humidity exceeds those recommended by ROHM
  - [c] the Products are exposed to direct sunshine or condensation
