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




Fig. 1 - Forward Current Derating Curve




Fig. 2 - Forward Power Loss Characteristics




Fig. 3 - Typical Instantaneous Forward Characteristics




Fig. 4 - Typical Reverse Leakage Characteristics Per Diode




Fig. 5 - Typical Junction Capacitance





Fig. 6 - Typical Transient Thermal Impedance
