The planar structure and the platinum doped life time control guarantee the best overall performance, ruggedness and reliability characteristics.

These devices are intended for use in snubber, output operation, inverters or as freewheeling diodes.

The extremely optimized stored charge and low recovery current minimize the switching losses and reduce power dissipation in the switching element.




Fig. 1 - Typical Forward Voltage Drop Characteristics




Fig. 2 - Typical Values of Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage

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


Fig. 3 - Typical Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage






Fig. 4 - Maximum Allowable Case Temperature vs. Average Forward Current

Fig. 5 - Forward Power Loss Characteristic








Fig. 6 - Typical Reverse Recovery vs. dl<sub>F</sub>/dt




Fig. 7 - Typical Stored Charge vs. dl<sub>F</sub>/dt

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



Fig. 8 - Thermal Impedance Z<sub>thJA</sub>


Fig. 9 - Reverse Recovery Waveform and Definitions


