

These devices are intended for use in snubber, boost, lighting, as high frequency rectifiers and freewheeling diodes.

The extremely optimized stored charge and low recovery current minimize the switching losses and reduce power dissipation in the switching element.




Fig. 1 - Typical Forward Voltage Drop Characteristics





Fig. 2 - Typical Values of Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage

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Fig. 3 - Typical Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage




Fig. 4 - Maximum Allowable Case Temperature vs. Average Forward Current




Fig. 5 - Forward Power Loss Characteristics




Fig. 6 - Typical Reverse Recovery Time vs. dI<sub>F</sub>/dt




Fig. 7 - Typical Stored Charge vs. dl<sub>F</sub>/dt



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
